

May we all have a blessed Eastertide!










Mission-our faith in action

Every day we have the opportunity to act as Jesus' disciples. A virtue is a good habit that helps us to act according to God's love for us.


Our 'Virtues to Live By' for the summer term are

- We have faith and hope even when things are difficult.







In RE, **Year 1** have been celebrating the Resurrection of Jesus. They listened to reflective music, decorated their empty cross and wrote prayers of thanks.





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
In their new science topic, the **Year 2** children have started looking at plants and how they grow. The children are conducting an investigation to see what conditions cress needs to grow healthily.

-Jesus- is Risen








Year 6 children spent some time this week studying a painting of the Resurrection and discussed what happened on Easter Sunday.

Focaccia is a flat leavened ovenbaked Italian bread. In Rome, it is similar to a type of flatbread called *pizza bianca*. Focaccia may be served as a side dish or as sandwich bread and it may be round, rectangular or square shape. Thumbs up were given for this tasty bread.











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
