
Mission-our faith in action (Mission 3-20.9.2024)

The children awarded the certificates this week have shown signs that they are living out this virtue in their daily lives in school.







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
Look at what else has been happening in school this week!







On Monday the children in **Reception and Reception/Year 1** took part in their very first PE lesson with Mr Wales. The children practised different skills such as balancing on one foot, hopping and travelling around the hall in different ways. All of the children worked hard and had lots of fun. Mr Wales was very impressed with how well the children listened and followed instructions to complete the different activities.







In Geography this week, **Year 1** looked at how to use an atlas and globes. They looked at different maps and then used the atlases to complete a scavenger hunt around the United Kingdom. They looked at the key to help them understand the symbols they would find on a map.






This week, **Year 2** attended a MindMate Champions assembly. They were visited by Jessie and Elise to learn new ways in which to focus on their own wellbeing. The children were taught different ways of calming and relaxing techniques such as being active and breathing techniques. The children really enjoyed the snake breath technique.









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In Computing, Year 2 learnt how to send an email as part of their online safety topic. They discussed whether it was safe to email people they do not know or open emails from places or people they are unfamiliar with. The children were then able to email a safe character from Purple Mash, Barnaby Bear, to see where he had been travelling this week. The children were introduced to a special feature of the email - report to teacher. They all enjoyed emailing Barnaby and are well prepared to send emails safely.







In Maths, **Year 2/3** used Base Ten to help them with their place value of numbers up to 100 and 1000.





On Tuesday, Year 3 enjoyed an assembly from MindMate to learn about resilience and having a growth mindset. The children learnt the power of 'yet'. They thought about the things they can't do yet such as: 'I can't swim yet'. They learnt with practise and a can-do attitude we can achieve anything.









In PE this week, Year 4 worked with Mr Wales to develop their stamina when running. The class explored the impact that their running speed had on their stamina. The class progressed from steady jogs, to sprints and measured the impact that this had on their bodies. Mr Wales explained the importance of opening your lungs to recover quicker.





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Year 4/5 have enjoyed exploring the Reading Area this week and have immersed themselves in reading. As the children will be learning all about Ancient Egypt this half term, they have loved reading a range of non-fiction texts all about Egypt. The children are particularly enthusiastic about the book they are studying in Literacy, 'Marcy and the Riddle of the Sphinx'. They cannot wait to learn more about what Marcy discovers in Ancient Egypt!





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Year 5/6 prepared a delicious pasta salad this week. They used various techniques including claw and bridge methods to cut their ingredients and discussed what a healthy and nutritious diet would include as part of their lesson.




























