
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# Mission- our faith in action Each week we send the children out with a 'mission' to actively live out their faith in their everyday lives.

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




Well done everyone!.



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
Children to wear colours of a country that brought victory in Europe, during World War II.

Our focus Skills Builder skill is Teamwork!



This skill applies to working within both formal and informal teams.

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This week in **Reception** and **Reception/Year 1**, the children have been learning about sharing and grouping in maths. The children worked together in small groups to share out different play equipment into groups of two, three and four. The children really enjoyed this activity and were able to share everything equally to make it fair. Wonderful work boys and girls!






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This week in **Year 1** the children had a cooking session linked to their topic 'Would you like to live in Leeds or Sydney?' The children made Anzac biscuits which are an Australian food. They enjoyed eating them as much as making them, yummy!





They were all keen to taste the vegemite dish and most of them thought that the dish was delicious, but some were not sure. Well done for trying everyone!







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This Spring term in Science **Year 2** have been investigating plants and how they grow. First, the children completed an experiment into what a plant needs to grow. They set up their experiment to test what conditions a plant will need to grow healthily. Each team had the same number of seeds and then one variable was change from the different groups such as no water. The children created a fair test using a test pot which had cotton wool, water, sunlight and the correct temperature. One group had no water, another had no cotton wool, another had no sunlight and the final test group did not have the correct temperature. The photographs below show their findings.





This week the children are investigating the function of the stem. They looked at a stem of a flower closely to see if they could see anything and then they placed white flowers in coloured water to see what might happen to them as the stem does its job. The children will find out later what has happened to the white flowers and if anything has changed!!!





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This week, **Year 4** visited Garforth Golf Club as part of their PE for this half term. The children have been working on chipping and putting for the past few weeks and it was great to be able to put those skills into practice at a local club. The facilities were brilliant and everyone at the club commented on the children's wonderful behaviour and golfing skills. Maybe we have a future Masters champion in the making! Well done everyone!



















#### Medical and dental appointments



Please book routine medical and dental appointments out of school hours or during school holidays in order not to disrupt your child's education.

Most routine medical appointments are relatively short so your child should be in school before and/or after their appointment where possible. A whole day off is rarely needed.

We must have proof of your child's appointment to cover the absence from school.

Where it is unavoidable to book out of school hours, please send a copy or a photo of the appointment to the school office via email <a href="mailto:admin@corpusprimaryleeds.org">admin@corpusprimaryleeds.org</a> at least three days before the appointment date.

Alternatively, you must call into the school at least three days before the appointment date and give in or show text information to school staff of the appointment.

Please also inform school the time you will need to collect your child.

On the day before the appointment, please send a Class Dojo or Tapestry message to your child's class teacher with the time your child is to be collected so that the teacher knows what time to send them to the school office.

If arrangements change or the collection is delayed, please contact the school office so that your child can remain in class and not lose valuable learning time.
