
Our 'Virtues to Live By' for the Summer term are








Mission-our faith in action

In the week ahead let us show the virtues of perseverance and resilience by being strong and courageous.







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

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This Thursday 8th May we celebrated the 80th anniversary of VE Day – Victory in Europe Day. The children came to school in 1940s style clothes or the colours of the United Kingdom and the Commonwealth as well as the Allied countries and the United States of America who all helped bring an end to the war in Europe.

We also recreated the street parties held eighty years ago by having a picnic style lunch outside.

We had a wonderful day celebrating and commemorating the bravery of all those who fought and lived through World War II!

Corpus Christi signed up for this experience for young people - **VE Mail** – which provided a unique opportunity for children and young people to learn first-hand about a shared story which connects the past, present and future, to hear it with their own ears, and witness it with their own eyes.

In 1945, people across the UK and beyond shared their stories of the war, leading up to the first VE Day, by writing to friends, family and loved ones. These letters act as a lasting legacy of their experiences.

We signed up to receive a letter from a Second World War Veteran; the one we received was from Sergeant Muhammed Hussain. Our children have written back to Sergeant Hussain to say thank you and explain what VE Day means to them now.

"Remember us—not with sorrow, but with pride. You are the next generation of peacemakers."

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

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

Our focus Skills Builder skill is....Teamwork!



This skill applies to working within both formal and informal teams.

Initially, this is about individuals fulfilling expectations around being positive, behaving appropriately, reliable and taking responsibility. This extends to understanding and respecting diversity of others' cultures, beliefs and backgrounds.

The next steps focus on making a contribution to a team through group decision making recognising the value of others' ideas and encourage others to contribute too.

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On Tuesday, the children in **Year 2** had a special visitor to talk to them about our new history topic Stone Age to Iron Age. Our visitor, Jess brought lots of activities for the children to complete ranging from hunting woolly mammoths in the Paleolithic period to making new inventions in the Mesolithic. Finally using a flint and steel to make fire in the Neolithic era.



Then the children teamed up with Year 2/3 and Year 3 to make 'Schoolhenge'. They also hunted Mrs Ball who became a woolly mammoth for the afternoon!!!



Iron Age to Stone Age





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This week, Year 2, Year 2/3, and Year 3 had the fantastic opportunity to take part in a hands-on Stone Age workshop led by The Past Presents. The children explored how life changed during the Stone Age, from hunter-gatherers to early farmers, and got a real sense of what daily life was like in prehistoric times.







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Pupils engaged in a wide range of interactive activities, including handling genuine and replica artefacts, dressing up in Stone Age clothing, weaving, spear-making, and even practising their aim with target games! It was a brilliant, immersive experience that truly brought history to life and offered a valuable and memorable learning opportunity for all.







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This week, **Year 4/5** enjoyed their cooking session where they baked banana and carrot cake. The class learnt all about the benefits of home cooking and how we can use alternative ingredients to make healthier choices. In the cakes we baked, we used bananas as an alternative to butter and carrot to use less sugar. The children did a fantastic job and loved eating their creations.
