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The Solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul




On Sunday, 29th June the Catholic Church celebrates the feast day of St Peter and St Paul who are two of the greatest saints in the Church.

Saint Peter and Saint Paul both had a great love for Jesus and spent their lives sharing his good news with as many people as they could.

Saint Peter was a fisherman when Jesus called him to be a disciple. He was a great friend of Jesus and, although he sometimes made mistakes, he became an important leader of the very first Christians. Jesus chose him to lead the Catholic church.

Saint Paul was originally called Saul. He did not like Jesus at first but then one day he had a vision of the risen Jesus and everything changed. He travelled many thousands of miles to share the message of Jesus. He also wrote many letters that are now in the Bible.

Both Saints Peter and Paul were bold followers of Jesus. They didn't just know who Jesus was in their heads, they knew it in their hearts.







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Year 3 Saint Peter and Saint Paul Collective Worship

Year 3 led a beautiful and meaningful collective worship this week, focusing on Feast of St Peter and St Paul, often referred to as the *Princes of the Apostles*. The children thoughtfully explained why these two saints hold such an important place in the history of the Church. 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




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Well done to our amazing footballers who came 4th in their morning league in the Catholic Schools Cup 7-a-side Football Tournament last Friday.

These children have all displayed amazing Leadership skills this week.












