

Year 6 said thanks to their parents and carers for supporting them on their primary school journey by inviting them to a meal prepared and served to them by their children.


Lots of hard work and a very busy day was had by the children but they thoroughly enjoyed it and the lovely comments from parents showed they did too

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Year 3 and Year 4 Djembe Performance


Last Thursday, pupils in Years 3 and 4 performed to parents and carers. It was wonderful to see how much they have learnt and progressed over the year. All pupils achieved their Red Djembe Certificate, demonstrating the skills they have developed throughout their drumming sessions – including how to hold the djembe correctly, keep a steady beat, repeat and build rhythms as well as play together as a group.





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During their topic sessions, **Year 4/5** have been learning all about the Vikings. The children have learnt about how the Vikings came to Britain and the many battles they fought. This week, the children have been learning the importance of the Viking shields and they also looked at Viking runes which was their writing system. 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EVERY SCHOOL DAY COUNTS TIPS FOR PARENTS BY PARENTS

Don't give in! Follow through. Be organised! Get everything ready from the night before. Have their coats and bags at the door, their lunch made and their clothes on the banisters.

Treat it like a military operation in the morning!

Don't give them a choice to stay at home.

Give yourself 15 minutes before the kids get up. No TV, iPad or phones allowed in the morning.

Keep talking about the importance of school.

Early to bed the night before school, especially after holidays. Come back to school after doctor/ dentist appointments.

Know how many days your child has missed in school.



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Free School Meals

Are you entitled?

Does your child qualify for free school meals?

Children may be eligible for free school meals if their parents or carers receive any of the following benefits:

- Income support
- Income based Job Seeker's Allowance
- Income based Employment and Support Allowance
- Child Tax Credit with an annual income of less than £16,190
- The guaranteed element of the State Pension Credit
- The guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- Universal Credit with an annual income of less than £7,400



This Catering Leeds leaflet has lots of information and advice.

If you get Working Tax Credit your child will not qualify for free school meals.

If a child receives free school meals, they will continue to get them, even if their parent's income changes. This will remain in place until Universal Credit is fully rolled out across the UK.

Children who are eligible for a free school meal can also get a free carton of milk.

Even if your child has the universal free school meal (Year Reception, Year 1 and Year 2) please apply for this benefit. The school receives money from central Government to support a variety of school initiatives that would be of benefit to your child.
