Our whole school Collective Worships led by Year 3 on Thursday and Mrs Walsh on Friday were based on the new commandment Jesus gave to the disciples.




In the week ahead, the children's mission is to keep Jesus' new commandment by showing love for one another and following the example of The Good Samaritan by helping others.

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Look at what else has been happening in school this week!

**Reception pupils** have participated in class Collective Worship this week. On the prayer table they placed: the green cloth, the Bible, a crucifix, and a candle. They listened carefully to the Gospel Reading, were very reverent during reflection time and joined in with familiar prayers.





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This half term the children in **Year 2** are focusing on Design Technology and will be making a fabric money pouch. They began their learning by practising sewing a running stitch on two pieces of felt to join them together. In order to do this, the children had to tackle threading a needle which was a task that proved challenging but they all got there with a little help! Well done children, we are very proud of you.




This week in Science the children in **Year 2** have been looking at the skeleton of different animals including humans. They have learnt some new vocabulary including vertebrates and invertebrates. The children were able to the x-rays of a range of animals into specific groups, depending on whether they had a backbone (vertebrate) or not (invertebrate). Then the children worked in groups to recreate the skeleton of a human. The children discussed the names of some of the bones that they already knew and were able to tell their teachers that humans are vertebrates.














In Science this week **Year 2/3** have been learning about 'Keeping Healthy.' They studied the human skeleton and identified all the different parts. They each cut a part out and worked together to create a skeleton in their groups. Finally, the children had a dance to 'Dem Bones' – they loved using different parts of the body to dance!













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This week, Year 4/5 have enjoyed taking part in a cooking class. The children learnt how to make pasta salad. They worked hard developing their cutting skills and learnt two new techniques to hold a knife safely when preparing food. The children really enjoyed eating their creations!

The **Year 4/5** children also enjoyed their singing lesson this week. They had a fantastic time learning new songs and developing their singing skills. They sang beautifully together!













**Year 6** enjoyed their first melodica lesson this year. They learnt all about 'pulse' which means to keep a steady beat and how to keep a rhythm. Year 6 also found out about the difference between quavers, crotchets and minims when reading musical notations.













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It was a fantastic start for the new **After School Cooking Club** this week. The children and their parents enjoyed chopping, grating and cutting various vegetables, herbs and cheese to include in the 'Chilli Non-Carne'. It looked delicious and they are looking forward to returning next week!

### Information for parents/carers regarding flu immunisations

Dear parent/guardian,

It is time for your child's yearly flu vaccination! This is offered to school years reception up to and including year 11.

Please use the link and individual school code below to complete your consent/refusal form. Access to the link will close 1 week before the session. Your school will inform you of the date our service will attend.

#### Why get your child vaccinated?

Flu can be a nasty illness and isn't just a bad cold. Giving your child the flu spray will protect them and will also help to keep more vulnerable friends and family members safe and well. The flu vaccination is quick, simple and free.

<u>www.nhs.uk/child-flu</u> has further information and tells you which children may need the flu injection instead of the nose spray.

#### Does the nasal spray contain porcine?

Yes, but it is a very purified version which is barely detectable. The vaccination is for medical purposes and has been deemed permissible for use by the British Fatwa Council.

#### Is there an alternative?

We do offer an injectable vaccine that **DOES NOT** contain porcine. This vaccine is only offered in high schools and SILC schools, primary aged children would need to attend one of our community clinics.



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### What if my child misses their vaccination in school?

Flu immunisation sessions will run in health centre(s), where available, for those primary school aged children requiring an injection or those in reception to year 11 who missed the session in school. We will send a text message to those who are eligible nearer the time, and we expect it to include the option to book an appointment directly onto our systems.

Please note, the flu vaccine is only offered by your GP if your child is in an at-risk group due to a health condition.

If your child becomes wheezy, has a bad attack of asthma, or has started steroid tablets for asthma after you submit your form, please contact the School Aged Immunisation Service to let us know.

If your child receives the vaccination elsewhere prior to the school session it is important that you let us know.
