


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### Mission (11th-17th October 2024)



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
#### Adoration and Exposition

#### **Reception's Mysterious Delivery**

There was lots of excitement in **Reception and Reception/Year 1** this week after they listened to the story 'Dear Zoo'. They received a letter from the zookeeper asking them to look after a new animal which was delivered in a mystery box! The children promised to look after it all week with the special task of trying to guess which animal was inside the box.



On Wednesday, the children spotted a claw peeping through a hole which supported their predictions. Finally, they were allowed to open the box and found a lovely panda. What a fun filled week of learning!






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This week in **Year 2** the children have been working hard in Maths. They are currently focusing on addition and subtraction and the children have been using practical equipment such as ten frames and base 10. The children used these resources to show their understanding of adding to the next ten within a hundred. The children in Year 2 are learning to apply these skills to solving word problems and reasoning questions.





In writing the children have been focusing on books by the same author- Oliver Jeffers. Firstly, they became authors themselves and wrote their own versions of the book 'Lost and Found' by changing the characters from the original story. Then the children have used the book 'The Day the Crayons Quit' as inspiration for writing letters. The children began by looking at the language used to complain and explore reasons why the crayons would quit working. The children then put themselves in the position of glue sticks, whiteboard pens and pencils in our class to write their own letter of complaint as the item they chose. They complained about the way they were treated in class which made interesting reading!




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In Science this week, **Year 2/3** conducted an investigation to test the use of their muscles. The children found it interesting to look at the different types of muscles in their bodies. For the investigation some children took part in measuring how many squats they could do and to keep this a fair test, keeping the squats the same.

Other children measured how long they could hold a bottle of water and to keep this test fair the water bottle had to be the same.

The one variable the children changed was by using different children to do the investigation.







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Year 3 visited church recently to role play the Sacrament of Baptism. The children learnt about each part of the Sacrament Baptism and used religious words to explain what happens.













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This week **Year 3** enjoyed preparing a delicious fruit and vegetable couscous. They used the bridge and claw method to chop the fruit and vegetables then learnt how to use a grater safely to grate the cheese. All the children enjoyed tasting the couscous with many of them tasting new foods for the first time.















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This week in their writing lessons, **Year 4** have been identifying the features of a non-chronological report and planning their own based on their topic of Ancient Egypt. In their writing lesson, the children identified common features across a range of examples and discussed these features as a class.

















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The children in **Year 4/5** have worked very had this week to create their own LED night lights as part of the Design Technology curriculum. The children learnt new skills such as engraving, soldering and cutting using a saw. The night lights they have created are linked to their Ancient Egypt topic. The children thought very carefully about how to incorporate this topic into their designs and have blown us away with their final product!





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Year 5/6 and Year 6 visited Eden Camp and to enhance their learning about World War Two. The children experienced what it was like to live in wartime Britain, experiencing the sights, sounds and smells of the time. Eden Camp is set in the original buildings and grounds of a Second World War prisoner of war camp. Each hut reconstructed scenes revealing the realities of day to day life on the Home Front, the front line and as a Prisoner of War (POW).









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

#### Dear parent/guardian,

It is time for your child's yearly flu vaccination! This is offered to school years reception up to and including year 11.

Please use the link and individual school code below to complete your consent/refusal form. Access to the link will close 1 week before the session. Your school will inform you of the date our service will attend.

#### Why get your child vaccinated?

Flu can be a nasty illness and isn't just a bad cold. Giving your child the flu spray will protect them and will also help to keep more vulnerable friends and family members safe and well. The flu vaccination is quick, simple and free.

www.nhs.uk/child-flu has further information and tells you which children may need the flu injection instead of the nose spray.

#### Does the nasal spray contain porcine?

Yes, but it is a very purified version which is barely detectable. The vaccination is for medical purposes and has been deemed permissible for use by the British Fatwa Council.

#### Is there an alternative?

We do offer an injectable vaccine that **DOES NOT** contain porcine. This vaccine is only offered in high schools and SILC schools, primary aged children would need to attend one of our community clinics.

#### What if my child misses their vaccination in school?

Flu immunisation sessions will run in health centre(s), where available, for those primary school aged children requiring an injection or those in reception to year 11 who missed the session in school. We will send a text message to those who are eligible nearer the time, and we expect it to include the option to book an appointment directly onto our systems.

Please note, the flu vaccine is only offered by your GP if your child is in an at-risk group due to a health condition.

If your child becomes wheezy, has a bad attack of asthma, or has started steroid tablets for asthma after you submit your form, please contact the School Aged Immunisation Service to let us know.

#### If your child receives the vaccination elsewhere prior to the school session it is important that you let us know.
