Also thank you to all the staff for preparing so thoroughly for the meetings.






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Mission (21st-25th October 2024)




• Tolerance of those of different faiths and beliefs




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This week, Year 3 have impressed Mrs Robinson, our peripatetic artist, with their artistic flair! The focus was drawing with pencil and charcoal. The children learnt about the famous Italian artist Giorgio Morandi, who was known for his drawings of still life using muted tones. The children created beautiful drawings of vases. Well done Year 3!











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This week, the Year 4 children took part in The Skipping School workshop. They learnt a range of new skips including the cross skip and the pretzel. The children will be demonstrating these skills in a competition in the summer term. The children really impressed the skipping coach with their newfound skipping skills!





















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Year 6 completed a DT Day linked to the topic World War 2. The children measured then cut wood to make a frame structure for an Anderson Shelter. They created a cutting station with a bench hook and clamp so the wood was safely held still while they used a junior hacksaw to cut the wood into four pieces. After that, they made triangle brackets, sanded their wood and constructed the top and bottom of their frame structure. Next, the children created a light with wires and led lights applying their prior knowledge of electrical circuits. Finally, they added the shell to the top of the shelter and decorated it with flags.





Our focus Skills Builder skill is....



This skill is all about how to communicate effectively with others, being mindful of whether they are talking to adults, friends or peers or other adults and also in different places.

Initially this skill focuses on being able to speak clearly – firstly with well known individuals and small groups and then with those who are not known.

The next stage is about being an effective speaker by making points logically, by thinking about what listeners already know and using appropriate language, tone and gesture.

Dear parent/guardian,

It is time for your child's yearly flu vaccination! This is offered to school years reception up to and including year 11.

Please use the link and individual school code below to complete your consent/refusal form. Access to the link will close 1 week before the session. Your school will inform you of the date our service will attend.

Why get your child vaccinated?

Flu can be a nasty illness and isn't just a bad cold. Giving your child the flu spray will protect them and will also help to keep more vulnerable friends and family members safe and well. The flu vaccination is quick, simple and free.

www.nhs.uk/child-flu has further information and tells you which children may need the flu injection instead of the nose spray.

Does the nasal spray contain porcine?

Yes, but it is a very purified version which is barely detectable. The vaccination is for medical purposes and has been deemed permissible for use by the British Fatwa Council.



Is there an alternative?

We do offer an injectable vaccine that **DOES NOT** contain porcine. This vaccine is only offered in high schools and SILC schools, primary aged children would need to attend one of our community clinics.

What if my child misses their vaccination in school?

Flu immunisation sessions will run in health centre(s), where available, for those primary school aged children requiring an injection or those in reception to year 11 who missed the session in school. We will send a text message to those who are eligible nearer the time, and we expect it to include the option to book an appointment directly onto our systems.

Please note, the flu vaccine is only offered by your GP if your child is in an at-risk group due to a health condition.

If your child becomes wheezy, has a bad attack of asthma, or has started steroid tablets for asthma after you submit your form, please contact the School Aged Immunisation Service to let us know.

If your child receives the vaccination elsewhere prior to the school session it is important that you let us know.
