The 40 days of Lent are based on two accounts: the 40 years of wandering by the Israelites and our Lord's 40 days in the wilderness at which point He was tempted by Satan.



Lent draws its inspiration from the 40 days Jesus spent in the desert. The Gospels tell us that after his baptism, Jesus fasted in the desert and then was tempted by the devil. He resisted these temptations and then went to Galilee to begin his public ministry.

Lent is an ancient English word meaning 'Springtime' and so it is a good time to 'spring clean' our lives by praying, fasting and carrying out acts of love so that we can truly be ready to celebrate Easter. Lent is a challenge, but it is also an opportunity to enhance our prayer life, to share our blessings by giving to others and to think before we eat.

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




Pupils in Year 5/6 proudly led the school and parish community in a special school Mass to mark the beginning of Lent, following Ash Wednesday during the holiday. The celebration was led by Canon Pat, who reminded everyone that Jesus loves each and every one of us.

He encouraged us to share that love with others, especially by helping those in need, for example through donating to a charity. He also spoke about the importance of asking for forgiveness during this holy season of Lent – a time for reflection, renewal, and bringing peace to those around us.





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Year 2 children were excited to welcome the Franciscan Sisters to their classroom, especially Sister Juan Maria, who is a new sister visiting all the way from New York. The sisters led us in prayer and joyful singing, filling the room with happiness.



They also talked about Saint Francis of Assisi, sharing that Pope Leo XIV has dedicated this year to him. The children thoughtfully discussed how Jesus might have looked and felt on the Cross and understanding that while he was suffering physically, in his heart he was making a loving sacrifice for us. It was a special and meaningful visit for everyone.





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As part of Other Faiths Week, the pupils took part in a special assembly led by a visitor. Narinder spoke to the children about the Sikh faith, explaining how it began with Guru Nanak in the 15th century and how the teachings have been passed down through the Ten Gurus. Narinder explained that being a Sikh is about being a good person and ensuring the wellbeing of all including sharing with others.

He also explained the importance of the Five Ks – the five articles of faith that show commitment and guide Sikhs in the way they live their lives. The children learned about: **Kesh** (uncut hair) **Kara** (steel bracelet) **Kirpan** (ceremonial sword) **Kanga** (wooden comb) **Kachera** (special cotton shorts)

Narinder also played traditional Sikh music, which the pupils really enjoyed. The session ended with an engaging question-and-answer time, where children had the opportunity to deepen their understanding and ask thoughtful questions as well as displaying their prior learning.

It is wonderful that the children in **Provision Class** have settled back so well into school and are already engaging enthusiastically in their learning. They have clearly enjoyed role-playing in the home corner, developing their both imagination and social skills, and have also made the most of the new outdoor resources. It is lovely to see their confidence and creativity shining through in both areas.

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This week, **Year 1** used a range of mathematical equipment to support them counting in tens and ones. The children worked with partners to create a number using Numicon, base ten, tens frames, cubes and beads. Then they had to identify how many tens and ones were in their number and record it on their whiteboards. They received lots of dojo points for great teamwork and accurate Maths work. Well done Year 1!





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Year 2 had a wonderful time in their most recent curriculum cooking session where they baked delicious rock buns! The children practised a range of important cooking skills, including carefully weighing and measuring ingredients and using the rubbing-in method to combine flour and butter with their fingertips until the mixture resembled breadcrumbs. They demonstrated excellent teamwork and communication as they took turns mixing, adding ingredients and shaping the dough into evenly sized portions.



The class also focused on hygiene and safety, remembering to wash their hands, tie back hair, and use utensils safely. The staff were so impressed with their enthusiasm and growing confidence in the kitchen – and the finished rock buns looked and smelt fantastic!



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It has been a fantastic first week back in **Year 4**! The children have returned from half term with a brilliant attitude and have worked incredibly hard across all subjects.

In Maths, they have been exploring fractions. The children have been identifying and comparing fractions, as well as developing their understanding of how fractions represent equal parts of a whole. They have shown great perseverance when tackling some tricky challenges!

Well done, **Year 4** – keep up the fantastic effort!



In Computing, we have started our new topic on 2Logo. This unit introduces the children to text-based coding, where they use commands to control an on-screen marker and create mathematical patterns. They are building on their prior learning from 2Go in Year 1 and are beginning to understand how precise instructions are needed to achieve the desired outcome. It has been wonderful to see their confidence growing as they experiment with different commands and debug their work.



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As part of our PE OAA (Outdoor and Adventurous Activities) curriculum this half-term, **Year 6** have been developing their orienteering skills.

In the first sessions, the children focused on reading trails and carefully following written directions to locate checkpoints and calculate a missing mathematical total. This activity required teamwork, effective communication, problem-solving and accurate map-reading skills.

The children were incredibly enthusiastic and worked exceptionally well in their small teams. It was wonderful to see them supporting one another, sharing ideas, and demonstrating resilience when faced with challenges.

We look forward to building on these skills in the coming weeks as they continue to develop their confidence and independence in outdoor learning.




This will take place in the hall after breakfast club from 8:40am - 9:15am and school staff will be in the hall to assist.




