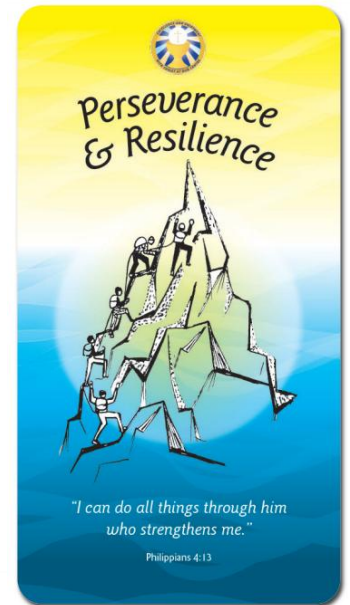
Mission- our faith in action

Each week we send the children out with a 'mission' to actively live out their faith in their everyday lives.

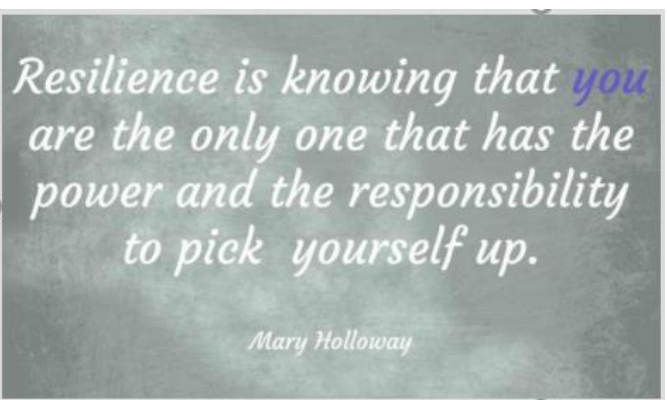
In the week ahead let us show the virtues of perseverance and resilience by

Virtues to Live By

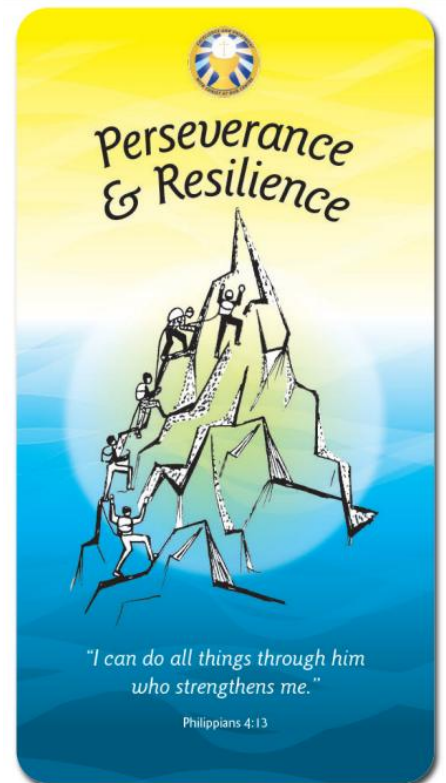

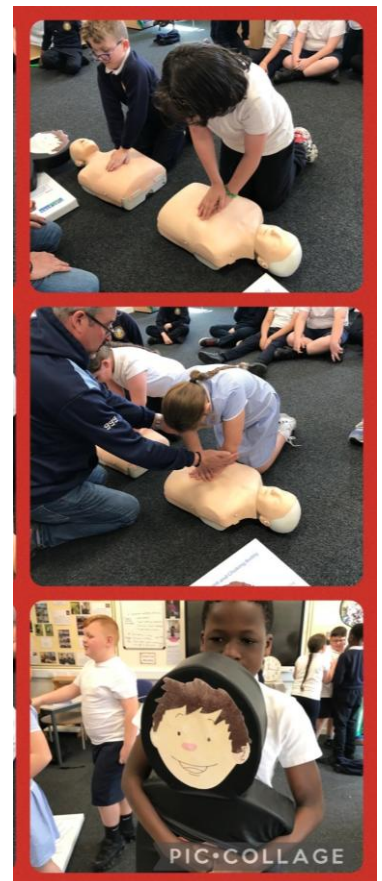
