It is golden because it's so valuable, and a way of living our life that is so simple, it shines for everyone to see.










This skill is all about how to communicate effectively with others, being mindful of whether they are talking to adults, friends or peers or other adults and also in different places.

Initially this skill focuses on being able to speak clearly – firstly with well known individuals and small groups and then with those who are not known.

The next stage is about being an effective speaker by making points logically, by thinking about what listeners already know and using appropriate language, tone and gesture.






Keeping Safe

Year 5 began their PSHE topic thinking about how they can keep themselves and their homes safe. The children worked as detectives to spot anything in a house that could be seen as unsafe and discussed a solution they would put in place to resolve this. Does your child qualify for free school meals?

Children <u>may be eligible</u> for free school meals if their parents or carers receive any of the following benefits:

- Income support
- Income based Job Seeker's Allowance
- Income based Employment and Support Allowance
- Child Tax Credit with an annual income of less than £16,190
- The guaranteed element of the State Pension Credit
- The guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- Universal Credit with an annual income of less than £7,400

If you get Working Tax Credit your child will not qualify for free school meals.

Even though children have the universal free school meal offer for Reception Year 1 and Year 2, which **does not offer** free milk, please apply for this benefit.

The school receives money from central Government to support a variety of school initiatives that would be of benefit to your child. Free School Meals also mean a free carton of milk each day!

We kindly ask that <u>all clothing</u> is clearly labelled with your child's name — especially jumpers, cardigans, tracksuit tops, jackets and coats. These items are often removed during the day and can easily get mixed up so labels really help us return them to the right owner.



Starting Secondary School

Children born between 1 September 2014 and 31 August 2015.

The application process for the parents of Year 6 pupils to apply on time started on 1st September 2025 and closes on 31st October 2025.
