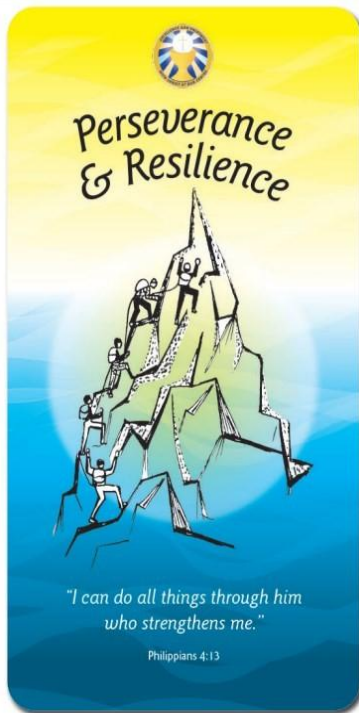

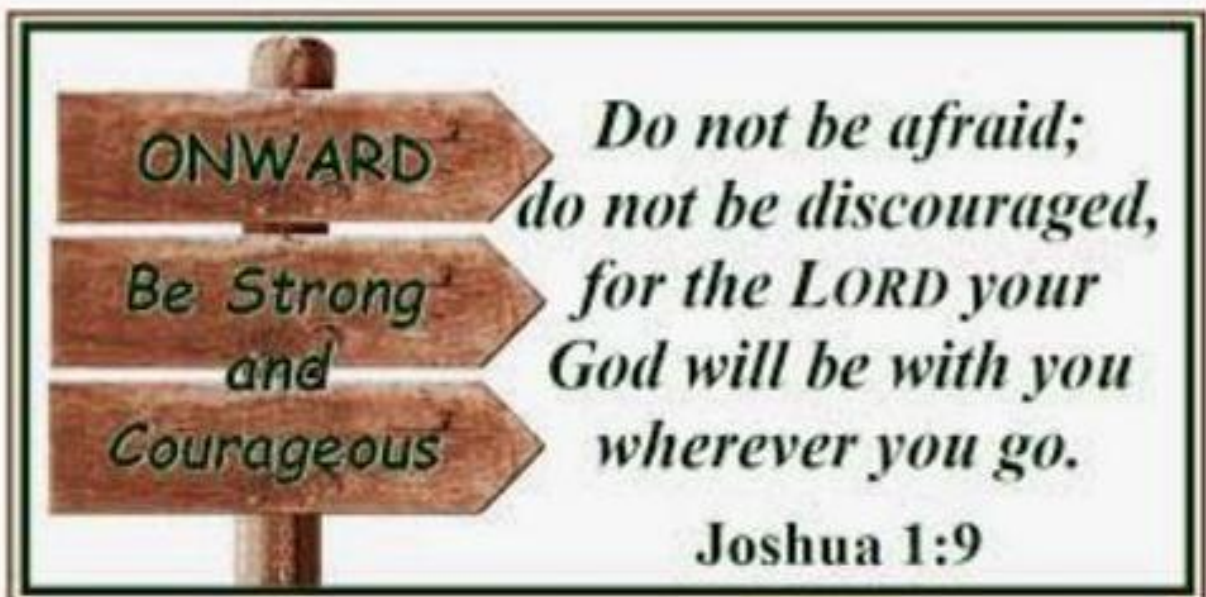
Mission- our faith in action

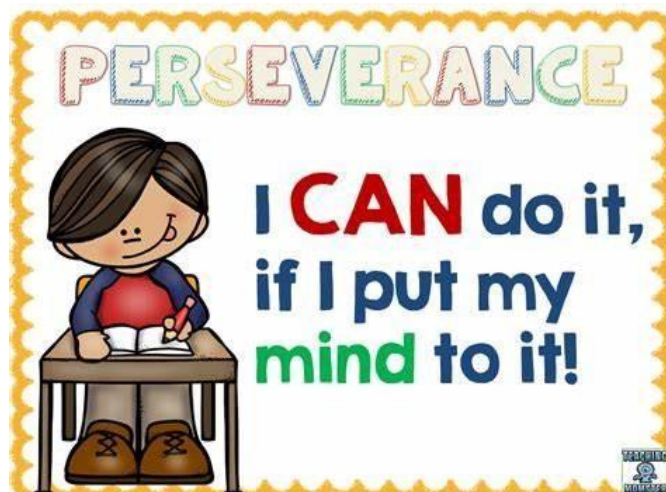

Year 3 delivered a beautiful and inspiring Celebration of the Word using the Parable of the Persistent Widow and the Unjust Judge (*Luke 18:1–8*)

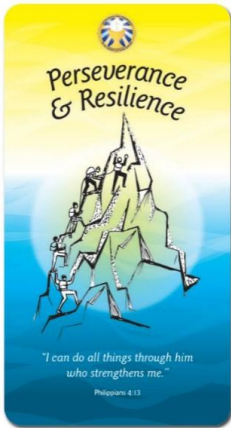
This powerful story linked closely with our school virtues of perseverance and resilience. In the story, a widow repeatedly goes to a judge who neither fears God nor cares about people, asking for justice against her adversary. At first, the judge ignores her, but because she keeps coming back and refuses to give up, he eventually grants her request just to stop her persistence. The lesson in this parable is to keep praying and not lose heart, trusting that God hears and will respond in the right time.



Year 3 also shared the story of Derek Redmond and his remarkable achievements. They told us about his unforgettable moment at the Olympics, showing incredible courage and determination when he faced injury but chose to keep going. He said, 'Just get up just one more time than you've been knocked down.'

The children helped us reflect on how we can all keep trying, even when things feel difficult, and support one another through challenges.

We are very proud of **Year 3** for presenting such a thoughtful and inspiring assembly.
