Year 1 attempting to stay safe in the tyres and get safely across the balance beams all whilst having so much fun!

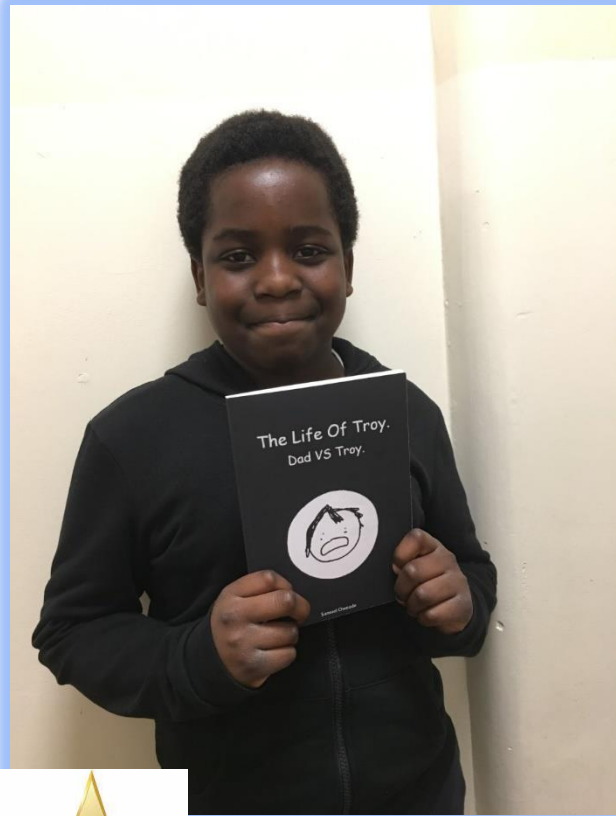




Well done **Year 2/3!!**
