These petitions will be offered each day during the times of prayer.







#### Look at what has been happening in school this week!



This week, in our **Provision**Class the children have been learning the Gingerbread Man story. We have made paintings using Gingerbread Man stamps, molded gingerbread cloud dough and used playdough to make gingerbread men with different sized cutters.



We have also been practicing saying the phonemes (sounds) for the graphemes (letters written down): 's, a, t, p, I, n'. We have worked hard to sort the pictures onto the correct grapheme according to the initial sound of the word.

#### **Outdoor Maths**

**Year 1** enjoyed participating in Maths outside this week. They used chalk to practise number formation as they worked independently in the playground. There was lots of counting and laughter along the way! At lunchtime, the children revisited their work and proudly showed the lunchtime staff their numbers. Well done, Year1!

This week in PE, Year 2 continued developing their fundamental movement skills with a focus on changing pace. Mr Wales introduced the idea of using "five gears," with Gear 1 representing slow walking and Gear 5 being full sprinting. The children enjoyed exploring the different speeds and showed great effort in applying them during races. They worked well both individually and as part of a team, showing excellent cooperation and enthusiasm.

Are you entitled?

Does your child qualify for free school meals?

Children <u>may be eligible</u> for free school meals if their parents or carers receive any of the following benefits:

- Income support
- Income based Job Seeker's Allowance
- Income based Employment and Support Allowance
- Child Tax Credit with an annual income of less than £16,190
- The guaranteed element of the State Pension Credit
- The guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- Universal Credit with an annual income of less than £7,400

If you get Working Tax Credit your child will not qualify for free school meals.

Even though children have the universal free school meal offer for Reception Year 1 and Year 2, this does not offer free milk, please apply for this benefit.

The school receives money from central Government to support a variety of school initiatives that would be of benefit to your child. ### **Starting Secondary School**

Children born between 1 September 2014 and 31 August 2015 The application process for the parents of Year 6 pupils to apply on time started on 1<sup>st</sup> September 2025 and closes on 31<sup>st</sup> October 2025. All applications received after this date <u>will not be considered</u> until after the national offer date of 2<sup>nd</sup> March 2026.
