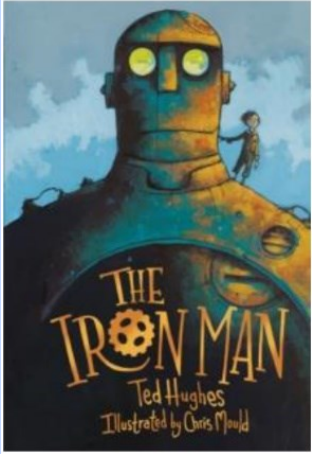

As part of Leeds City Council 'Year of Reading', we invited the talented local author and illustrator, **Chris Mould**, who recently created a beautifully illustrated version of the classic book, 'The Iron Man'. He shared some top tips with children and modelled how he used letters and numbers to help create his illustrations. ## Year 5

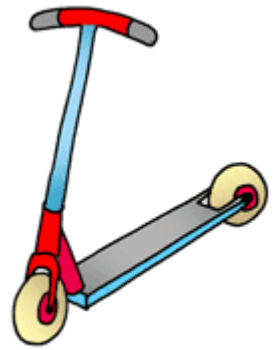
On Friday the children in Year 5 took part in Scooter training.

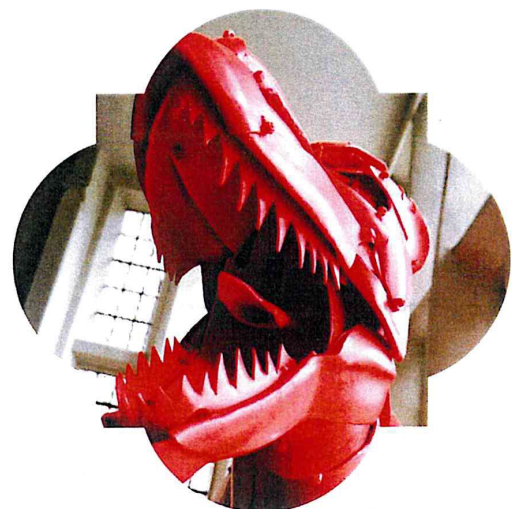
