Catholic Life of the School



The month of October is dedicated to the Holy Rosary, one of the best known of all Catholic devotions. October includes the Feast of Our Lady of the Rosary (7th October).

The Rosary draws its mysteries from the New Testament and is centred on the great events of the Incarnation and Redemption with each decade referring to an event in the life of Jesus and Mary. The Mysteries of the Rosary give us "thumbnails" of the life of Christ and his Mother Mary.

- The Joyful Mysteries are taken mostly from Saint Luke's Gospel in the New Testament. They involve the joyful events of Jesus' childhood.
- The Luminous Mysteries bring a deeper understanding to the public life of Jesus. They fill in the gaps between the childhood of Jesus and His suffering and death on the cross.
- The Sorrowful Mysteries remind us of how much Jesus loves us. They recall how He suffered and died just for us.
- The Glorious Mysteries tell us what happened after Jesus died-His Resurrection, the descent of the Holy Spirit and the love Jesus had for his Mother Mary.

The Rosary is a powerful weapon. Use it with confidence and you'll be amazed at the results.



Year 5 - World War 1 History Work



This week in cooking Year 5/6 made butterfly buns. They followed the recipe carefully, measuring out the ingredients using weighing scales and mixing the ingredients together in a bowl. Once they had the right consistency, the mixture was poured into individual bun cases and placed in the oven.

















When the buns had cooled, the tops were sliced off and cut in half to create the butterfly wings. The children then placed the prepared buttercream onto the top of the buns and the 'wings' were added. Very tasty and enjoyed by all!
