They suggested some weird and wonderful scenarios-what amazing Imaginations! Everyone had lots of fun! The session concluded with a question and answer session which enabled the children to gain more insight into being an author. The children were engaged and enthusiastic for the whole afternoon and really enjoyed learning from this inspirational author.





Stephen Waterhouse Author Visit

On Tuesday the author and illustrator Stephen Waterhouse visited for a whole school assembly. In the morning he spoke to Years 5 and 6 about what inspired him to be an author and illustrator when he was young. He explained the process of developing characters and then worked with the children to design their own original creations. All the children had great fun inventing their individual characters.

In the afternoon, Stephen read 'Engines' to Year 1 and Year 1/2 which is a short story he has illustrated himself. He showed the children how to make a character by drawing around their hands. Finally, Stephen read 'The Runaway Chapati' to Years 1 and 2 and he showed the children how to turn their favourite food into a runaway character! Everyone had a very creative and inspiring day!
