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

The children awarded the certificates this week have shown signs that they are living out this virtue in their daily lives in school.







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
#### **Mission**


Each week we send the children out with a 'mission' to actively live out their faith in their everyday lives.

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Last week the children in **Year 6** went to visit the Statue of the Immaculate Heart of Mary and the Relics of Saints Francisco and Jacinta Marto at Leeds Cathedral.

The statue is a representation of Our Lady of Fatima. It was in Fatima, Portugal that Our Lady appeared to three children Francisco, Jacinta and their cousin Lucia dos Santos in 1917.

The visit to Leeds Cathedral gave the Year 6 children the opportunity to pray to Our Lady through The Rosary and to celebrate Mass with parishioners of the Diocese as well as to offer prayers of intention to be taken back to Fatima.

Well done, Reception!






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The children in **Provision Class** have enjoyed exploring paint and using carrots as tools to make different marks. They experimented with colour, shape and texture, showing curiosity and creativity throughout the activity.

This activity helped the children to strengthen their fine motor control as they gripped and pressed the carrots in different ways. They also developed their hand-eye coordination and began to make intentional marks, an important early step in prewriting skills.

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In maths, the children have been creating repeated patterns using two different coloured bears.

When children create repeated patterns using two different coloured bears like this. They are learning about patterns and sequences which are an important foundation for mathematical thinking.





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In Science this half term, the children in **Year 1** have been learning about the human body. Each week, the children have taken part in investigations using one of their five senses. They have been very enthusiastic over the half term and have thoroughly enjoyed using their senses of smell, sight, hearing, touch and taste. 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To mark the end of the first half term, Mr Wales organised a fun and engaging PE intra competition for **Year 2** to consolidate the fundamental skills the children have been practising over the past few weeks. The events included jumping, hurdles, throwing and relay races. It was fantastic to see the children applying their skills with such enthusiasm and team spirit. Congratulations to the Blue Team, who were the overall winners of the competition.







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This half term, the children in **Year 2** have enjoyed a fantastic art project with Mrs Robinson, inspired by the work of British artist Bridget Riley. She is known for her striking optical illusion artwork. As part of the project, the children began by researching Bridget Riley's life and artistic style, developing an understanding of how she uses shape, line and contrast to create movement and visual effects. Then they had the opportunity to practise creating their own optical illusion designs, experimenting with patterns and repetition. To complete the project, each child created a final piece using block printing techniques. The results were impressive, well done to all the children for their focus, effort and artistic flair!















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## Pok-ta-Pok An Ancient Maya ball game

This week, Year 3 have been learning all about pok-ta-pok, an ancient Mayan ball game. Pok-ta-pok was played between two teams using a heavy rubber ball, and the aim was to get the ball to the other side of the court—without using hands or feet! After exploring how the game was played and its importance in Mayan culture, the children had great fun creating and playing their own version of pok-ta-pok in the hall, working together in teams and showing fantastic energy and teamwork.



















The children worked in teams to uncover clues and evidence to support their own theories. Then they presented their ideas to the class, sharing a range of interesting and thoughtful explanations about the mystery of the Maya civilisation.








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This week, the **Year 4** children enjoyed their first cooking experience of the year – making **fruit and vegetable couscous**!

First, the children had to remember and demonstrate the cutting and chopping skills they learned in Year 3 — using the *claw* and *bridge* methods — to prepare the ingredients for their couscous. They took turns chopping celery, black olives, tomatoes, cucumber, and peppers. Before adding the ingredients, the children sampled each one individually — and surprisingly the olives were a big hit while the celery was one they would give a miss! Once everything was prepared, they mixed all the fruits and vegetables into the couscous and were delighted to taste their colourful creations.









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On Monday, some of our Year 5 and Year 6 children were selected to take part in an Indoor athletics event against other local schools at Temple Moor High School. The events were split into field and track events such as javelin, long jump, triple jump and relay races.







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The children really enjoyed themselves and came away as winners of the competition! Our school dominated every event and every pupil involved showcased their skill and the hard work they have been putting in.

A big thank you to the parents and carers who were able to support with transport and stayed to cheer on our children and see the school's success.









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Last Monday, some of our **Year 2** children took part in a football competition at Fives alongside teams from lots of other schools. For many, it was their first ever competitive match — and they absolutely loved it! Every child played with a smile on their face and showed fantastic determination, teamwork, and sportsmanship right to the final whistle.
