

# Acceptable Use Policy Agreement for Parents/Carers

Digital technologies have become integral to the lives of children and young people, both within schools and outside school. These technologies provide powerful tools, which open up new opportunities for everyone. They can stimulate discussion, promote creativity and stimulate awareness of context to promote effective learning. Young people should have an entitlement to safe internet access at all times.

#### This Acceptable Use Policy is intended to ensure:

- that young people will be responsible users and stay safe while using the internet and other communications technologies for educational, personal and recreational use.
- that school / academy systems and users are protected from accidental or deliberate misuse that could put the security of the systems and users at risk.
- that parents and carers are aware of the importance of online safety and are involved in the education and guidance of young people with regard to their on-line behaviour.

The school will try to ensure that pupils will have good access to digital technologies to enhance their learning and will, in return, expect the pupils to agree to be responsible users. A copy of the Pupil Acceptable Use Policy is attached to this permission form, so that parents/carers will be aware of the school expectations of the young people in their care.

### Use of Digital / Video Images

The use of digital/video images plays an important part in learning activities. Pupils and members of staff may use digital cameras to record evidence of activities in lessons and out of school. These images may then be used in presentations in subsequent lessons.

Images may also be used to celebrate success through their publication in newsletters, on the school website and occasionally in the public media. Where an image is publicly shared by any means, only your child's first name will be used.

The school will comply with the Data Protection Act and request parents/carers permission before taking images of members of the school. We will also ensure that when images are published that the young people cannot be identified by the use of their names.

In accordance with guidance from the Information Commissioner's Office, parents/carers are welcome to take videos and digital images of their children at school events for their own personal use (as such use in not covered by the Data Protection Act). To respect everyone's privacy and in some cases protection, these images should not be published / made publicly available on social networking sites, nor should parents/carers comment on any activities involving other pupils in the digital/video images.

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## Use of Cloud Systems Permission Form

The school uses 2Simple (Purple Mash), Earwig, Tapestry, Class Dojo for pupils and staff. This permission form describes the tools and pupil responsibilities for using these services.

The following services are available to each pupil as part of the school's online presence in 2 Simple (Purple Mash) and Class Dojo. Whilst Earwig and Tapestry are solely used by teachers and parents.

Using 2Simple (Purple Mash) will enable your child to collaboratively create, edit and share files for school related projects and communicate via email with other pupils and members of staff. With this they have their own individual login.

Using Class Dojo will enable your child and their teachers to share photographs and videos of their learning with you. Other parents in your child's class may have access to some of this data if it is shared on the class page.

Earwig and Tapestry allow teachers to upload assessment evidence for all areas of the curriculum. This can then be shared with parents as a photograph or video. Children do not have access to these services.

These services are entirely online and available 24/7 from any internet-connected computer.

The school believes that use of these tools significantly adds to your child's educational experience.
