Holocaust Memorial Day will be held at Lambeth Town Hall on Sunday 22<sup>nd</sup> January 3pm - 4.30 pm. The theme this year is Ordinary; to consider how ordinary people, such as ourselves, can perhaps play a bigger part than might imagine in challenging prejudice we today. Speakers will include Cllr Claire Holland, Leader of Lambeth Council, a keynote speech from Holocaust survivor Joan Salter MBE, and readings and musical from performances from children Lambeth schools.
