Who can use the Pantry?
Everyone! No referral or financial checks - just come along.

How much do I get?
This is a sharing project. Portions vary based on weekly stock and sometimes you'll get extras. We do our best with what we receive and you choose how much you want to spend.

Where does the money go?
Your payments ensure a diverse range of good quality food and some pantry running costs. Tell the volunteers what you'd like to see. More members = more variety. Our goal is a self-sustaining, dignified food model.

What kind of food can I get?
A mix of bought and donated food. Lots is fresh but we also offer a range of long-life cupboard staples, and when we can, toiletries and household items. New things come in all the time.

What is surplus food?
The UK wastes 10.7 million tonnes of food yearly. Farmers, supermarkets, caterers and food businesses donate due to bumper crops, wonky shaped produce, and over ordering. Surplus food rescue charities The Felix Project and City Harvest, supply most of our surplus including fresh, frozen, and long-life items.

Is surplus food safe to eat?
Yes! Most is as fresh as in shops. We never offer food past its use-by date as this could harm your health and is against the law. Some food may be near or past **best before date** but it is still safe to eat. Visit wrop.ngo for more info

Secondary School Transfer

Year 6 parents need to apply online through your home borough for your child's secondary school place. Please ensure you complete this by midnight Saturday 31st October 2026. Primary School Applications for Reception 2027 - Apply Online and On time

The application process is now open for children joining Primary School September 2027. You **MUST** make an application to your home borough for your child's school place, if you live in Lambeth please follow [this link](#). If you are applying for a place at Corpus Christi School you also need to complete an online [Additional Information Form](#).

Nursery applications also require an [Additional Information Form](#), you do not need to apply through your home borough. Closing date is 15th January 2027.
