










Tamika reads Nicola Davies' The Day War Came – a powerful story of the journey of a child forced to become a refugee when war destroys everything she has ever known.





June 22 marks the anniversary of the arrival of the Empire Windrush at Tilbury Docks in 1948, bringing workers from Caribbean islands to fill post-war labour shortages in the UK. The ship carried 492 passengers – many of them children. It marked the beginning of multicultural Britain. The UK celebrates Windrush Day to honour the British Caribbean community. 




Prize-winning Author Venessa Taylor – Baller Boys Tuesday 15 June, 11am Contact: sdavidson@lambeth.gov.uk


