NSPCC

As part of our safeguarding curriculum to keep children safe, we deliver NSPCC programmes to our children. We have undertaken this for many years now and this has been a valuable support to our safeguarding arrangements. The Early Years and Infants receive Pantosaurus, developed in consultation with children, parents, carers and teachers. This programme helps children understand their body belongs to them, and they should tell a safe adult they trust if anything makes them feel upset or worried. Year 2 to Year 6 receive Speak Out. Stay Safe which is a safeguarding programme for children aged 5- to 11-years-old. It helps children understand:

- abuse in all its forms and how to recognise the signs of abuse
- that abuse is never a child's fault and they have the right to be
- where to get help and the sources of help available to them, including their Childline service.

The children raised money for the NSPCC on Number Day to support the valuable work which the NSPCC does in schools. Next week, Years 2-6 will take part in Speak Out. Stay Safe with an assembly. In addition, Years 2, 5 and 6 will undertake a workshop led by the NSPCC. Parents of these year groups will have received a letter to detail the programme. The NSPCC has an excellent website, including support for parents, if you wish to know more about their work to safeguard children.

ParentPay Balances



Information received this week from Lambeth Public Health

It is anticipated that there will be a potential increase in measles cases associated with schools. Measles is a very infectious virus that can spread from person-to-person quickly, especially in education and childcare settings. A person with measles can spread the infection in the 4 days before they get the rash. Once a person has the rash, they can still spread the infection for another 4 days.

The measles, mumps and rubella (MMR) vaccine is the safest and most effective way to protect against measles. People need 2 doses of MMR vaccine to be protected against measles, mumps and rubella.

Parents are being advised to check their MMR immunisation status with their GPs and to access catch-up vaccinations if they are under- or unvaccinated.
