#### Windrush 75

On Thursday 22nd June, the school celebrated Windrush Day to celebrate and commemorate the contributions made by the Windrush Generation to the social, economic and religious life in Britain since the Second World War. The children had an assembly in the main hall and reminded us of the 'shared history' we all have. The assembly was attended by local MPs Bell Ribeiro-Addy, Florence Eshalomi and Cllr Sonia Winfred. This was followed in the school playground by a concert performed by the World-Famous School Band and the Samba Reggae Band. The children also used steel pans for the first time which were gratefully loaned to us by St James the Great Catholic School in Thornton Heath.
