Tulse Hill Area Low Traffic Neighbourhood

You should have received a letter this week detailing the implementation of an emergency transport programme in response to Covid-19 from Lambeth Council. The intention of the programme is to provide safe and accessible transport options for all people in the borough and in this case Tulse Hill in particular. The direct consequence of this is that no motor vehicles may travel in either direction through points on roads between A204 Tulse Hill and A23 Brixton Hill. At the moment this is temporary but will be enforced by Automatic Number Plate Recognition cameras. It is expected that this will affect journey times from Tulse Hill and surrounding areas to school, so you should allow more time to travel, especially if you drive.

Attendance

Attendance at Corpus Christi remains high and we are very pleased with how staff, children and parents have adapted to procedures and measures that are in place across the school to keep everyone safe. At home it would be helpful and worthwhile to remind your child of the need for regular washing of hands with either soap or using hand sanitiser for effective hygiene. **Additionally, at drop-off and pick-up time, it is important that parents remember to social distance and do not crowd around school entry points talking to other parents.** Also, it would be beneficial if only one parent brings their child to school to ensure that the streets outside school are not too busy. Remember the benefits of attending school every day far outweigh the risk from Covid 19.

Google Classroom

You should have received a letter from Miss Kriechbaum today regarding the school's progress on the introduction of Google Classroom. It is important to note that blended or home learning will only be provided when a pupil is self-isolating following a positive test for Covid-19 or a child is self-isolating due to close contact with a person who has tested positive. Home learning will also take place if there is a local or full lockdown. If a child is unwell at home - no home learning will be provided.

Primary School Transfer

If your child was born between 01/09/2016 and 31/08/2017 your child should be starting primary school in September 2021. Nursery parents need to apply online through your home borough for your child's primary school place. This is known as a common application form. Please ensure you complete this by midnight Friday 15th January 2021. If you apply after this date the likelihood of gaining a place at your preferred school may be significantly reduced therefore, apply online and apply on time.

Secondary School Transfer

Year 6 parents need to apply online through your home borough for your child's secondary school place. Please ensure you complete this by midnight Saturday 31st October 2020. Some secondary schools are providing virtual tours for prospective parents as open days/evenings may not be possible. Please do check the secondary school's websites for more details.

Flu Immunisation Programme 2020

Thank you to those parents who have returned the consent form to school. The flu immunisation programme that will take place in school on Wednesday 4th November 2020 - all children from Reception to Year 6 can receive the flu vaccine. Please complete and return the consent form to school, via email if possible, or the school office by Monday 28th September 2020. If you are unable to complete the form online, paper copies are available from the school office. **THE FORM NEEDS TO BE COMPLETED AND RETURNED EVEN IF YOU DO NOT WISH YOUR CHILD TO RECEIVE THE VACCINE.**
