NHS Track and Trace

To support the NHS Test and Trace process, Public Health England has asked that schools remain contactable in the halfterm so they can assist with contact tracing. The guidance is as follows: if your child tests positive for coronavirus (COVID-19), having developed symptoms within 48 hours of being in school, then we will need to be contacted to identify close contacts and advise self-isolation, as they may have been infectious whilst in school. If your child tests positive for coronavirus (COVID-19), having developed symptoms more than 48 hours since being in school, the school does not need to be contacted.

If you need to contact the school, we will need to know your contact details, the date in which symptoms first appeared and/or the date in which the test was taken. This information will assist us when identifying close contacts and advising self-isolation.
