This month is Black History Month and as a school we are celebrating the enormous contribution Black Britons have made to our vibrant and diverse society. #### Pick-Up

The school has tried hard to ensure that it has not been necessary to stagger drop-off and pick-up times before and after school, as this can be a great inconvenience to parents. This has involved using seven entry points across the school. Generally, this has worked well, but there have been occasions were parents do spill off the pavement and onto the road. This is especially true on Lambert Road. You should ensure that this does not happen because not only is it causing an obstruction on the road, but it is also dangerous. Parents should queue along the wall in a socially distanced way and avoid crowding around the gate entrances and exits — this is why we have given a fifteen-minute window to help with congestion at busy times of the day. It might also be worthwhile to park on streets further away from school and walk — again this would help with congestion.

### Primary School Transfer

If your child was born between 01/09/2016 and 31/08/2017 your child should be starting primary school in September 2021. Nursery parents need to apply online through your home borough for your child's primary school place. This is known as a common application form. Please ensure you complete this by midnight Friday 15<sup>th</sup> January 2021. If you apply after this date the likelihood of gaining a place at your preferred school may be significantly reduced therefore, apply online and apply on time.

### Secondary School Transfer

Year 6 parents need to apply online through your home borough for your child's secondary school place. Please ensure you complete this by midnight Saturday 31st October 2020. Some secondary schools are providing virtual tours for prospective parents as open days/evenings may not be possible. Please do check the secondary school's websites for more details.

### Flu Immunisation Programme2020

Thank you to those parents who have returned the consent form to school. The flu immunisation programme that will take place in school on Wednesday 4<sup>th</sup> November 2020 - all children from Reception to Year 6 can receive the flu vaccine. There only a few forms that have not been returned, please complete and return the consent form to school, via email if possible. If you are unable to complete the form online, paper copies are available from the school office. THE FORM NEEDS TO BE COMPLETED AND RETURNED EVEN IF YOU DO NOT WISH YOUR CHILD TO RECEIVE THE VACCINE.
