### **Children's Mental Health Week**

The children have had a busy, yet reflective, week to take part in a range of activities to support their understanding of 'Children's Mental Health Week' and what that means to them. The 'Express Yourself' theme has been taught across the school through a range of curriculum areas and the children have had many opportunities to reflect on the ways they can express their feelings through art, music, dance and so on.

Across the school children have been taking part in a range of activities, some examples include learning about and making worry dolls through the story 'Ruby's Worry'; taking part in a virtual 'Express Yourself' show and tell; exploring feelings through typography art and creating list poems about letting go and looking forward. This has been a great opportunity for us as a school community to reconnect with our own mental health and wellbeing, and for us all to take the time and space to reflect on how we feel particularly during these uncertain times.

The important message we share with the children is that it is okay not to feel okay at times and to ensure we equip our children with the tools to support them in expressing their feelings.

### **Safer Internet Day**

Next Tuesday is Safer Internet Day. The theme this year is 'An Internet We Trust'.

Safer internet day 2021 celebrates the amazing range of information and opportunities online, and its potential to inform, connect and inspire us, whilst also looking at how young people can separate fact from fiction.

The campaign focuses on how we can decide what to trust online, supporting young people to question, challenge and change the online world for the better. It will explore how influence, persuasion and manipulation can impact young people's decisions, opinions and what they share online.

For the older children, the day will also look at the emotional impact navigating a misleading online world can have on young people and why it is important to create a supportive, critical, and questioning culture online that encourages debate and discussion. We want to give young people the skills to support one another, and the strategies to spot and speak out against harmful and misleading content online.
