# From the Headteachers

### Welcome Back

We hope you and your family had an enjoyable half-term break. We welcomed children back to school from half-term this week and we have all settled back into school routines and procedures. Today the children had a 'Dressing Up Day' on behalf of the Parents' Association and we thank you all for supporting school events as always. Next week we will be conducting a Remembrance Service with a small number of Year 6 children in the main hall which will be viewed by the rest of the school community in classrooms on Wednesday.

### Parking

We ask you to be considerate of others when parking near or on the surrounding roads around school. Please keep clear of the yellow zigzag lines on all roads and avoid doing three-point turns – it is much easier and safer for the children if you drive around the block. There are now traffic wardens outside school, and we ask everyone to be respectful of each other and not get into altercations with other parents over parking.

### <u>COVID-19</u>

As I am sure you are aware there have been several government announcements and updates this week with England entering a national lockdown as of yesterday Thursday 5th November.

Please note that whilst we are currently in a national lockdown, this does not currently affect the running of schools which continue to remain open. We therefore would expect children to attend school unless instructed otherwise.

Clinically extremely vulnerable people in England have received further guidance on keeping safe. The new advice details further precautions those in this group can take on top of the tougher national measures being introduced, as cases continue to rise across the country. Everyone not considered to be clinically extremely vulnerable will be expected to follow the new restrictions, such as staying at home unless shopping for food or exercising and restricting meeting up with people outside of the household.

As evidence has shown there is a very low risk of children becoming very unwell from COVID-19, most children originally on the shielded patient list, now no longer need to be shielding and therefore can attend school. If you are unsure, parents should contact their child's GP or hospital clinician. If a GP or clinician has advised that a child should remain on the shielded patient list, they are advised not to attend school.

### Primary School Transfer

If your child was born between 01/09/2016 and 31/08/2017 your child should be starting primary school in September 2021. Nursery parents need to apply online through your home borough for your child's primary school place. This is known as a common application form. Please ensure you complete this by midnight Friday 15<sup>th</sup> January 2021. If you apply after this date the likelihood of gaining a place at your preferred school may be significantly reduced therefore, apply online and apply on time.

If your circumstances have changed recently and you think you may be entitled to free school meals for your child (Years 3-6) please collect an application form from the school office. Music fees for the Autumn Term 2 are now available to pay on your Parentpay account. If your child is sitting a music exam in December, the fee is also available to pay on Parentpay.
