Payment of Services

We want to thank parents for acting promptly paying for elective services contributions towards trips and residentials. Many schools outsource extended care and activity clubs, but we like to keep control of these and use staff known to the school. As a result, our admin staff take on the additional responsibility of organising these and recovering payment towards staffing and resources. When deciding on services you want for your child, it is important to ensure this is affordable and you do not get into debt. Debt recovery is time consuming and uncomfortable for parents and staff.
