Applications will be considered carefully in order to give as many children as possible a chance at an after school activity. Applications will only be considered for children with up to date balances on all services, including dinner money, music, trips etc.

Consideration will NOT be given to children with outstanding balances on any service as at Friday 20th March 2020

Applications to be made by 12 noon Monday 23rd March 2020. If you have been successful in securing a place in a club, you will be notified by the item appearing on your ParentPay account on Thursday 26th March 2020, you will then have until Wednesday 1st April to secure the place by paying for it. After that time it will be released to others with clear balances on a first come first serve basis.

Corpus Christi also has a number of Sports Teams who represent the school in competitive matches. Please note that membership of a club does not guarantee a place on a competitive team.

Children can record their times and compare these over the weeks to see an improvement in their fitness.</p>
<p>Self-Defence</p> <p>Year 5 & 6</p>	 <p>Mr Howarth</p>	<p>Krav Maga Brixton builds children's confidence through basic self-defence. As well as being able to deliver basic strikes and kicks, children learn how to break free from grabs, and how to land safely if they fall.</p> <p>They are able to bring questions and we discuss the law and morality around use of force as well as principles of compassion and solidarity in line with a Catholic ethos.</p>
