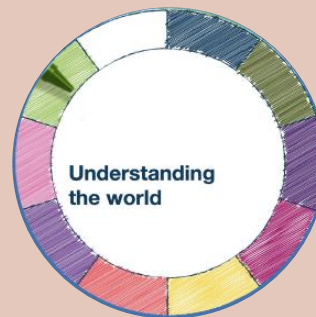
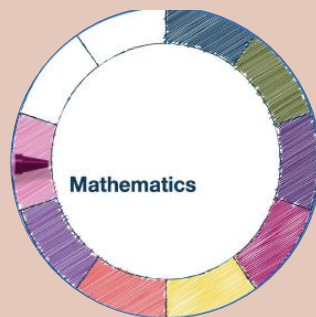
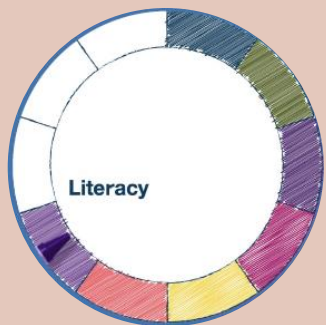
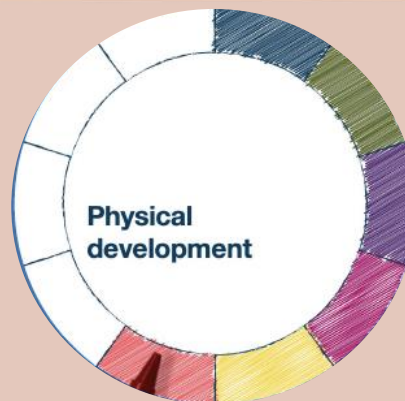
Through play, children develop:

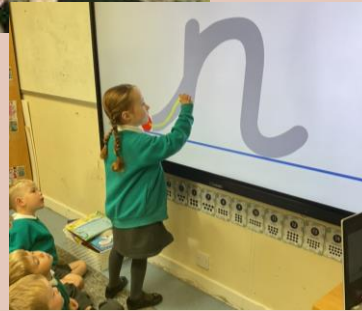
