Class News

This half term, Acorn Class have been learning all about farms. This week, we have been doing some wonderful reading about 'The Little Red Hen'. We have written super adjectives to describe what she looks like and then we even did some superb acting! Acorn Class have also thoroughly enjoyed our writing unit, this week, about a book called 'The Proudest Blue'. We have been discussing what a Hijab is and why some people choose to wear them. We cannot wait to learn more about this book! Acorn Class are really looking forward to our visit to the Smithills Farm on 25th June.

Oak Class have worked extremely hard, showing determination and positivity when completing their phonics screening checks, this week. Year One have also been immersed in their new class text 'The Storm Whale' and have been producing wonderful pieces of writing, using prepositions and adverbs. We have been learning about money in maths and using coins and notes to complete arithmetic questions. Oak Class have also been exploring the rainforest and the different animals we could find there. We are looking forward to completing our own fact files.

In Elm Class, we are loving our new English books: 'The Lighthouse Keeper's Lunch' and 'The Secret of Black Rock'. The children have really enjoyed learning about the lighthouse keeper's character and loved their

experience day, tasting different foods we could pack in his lunchbox! In Geography, we have been exploring the oceans of the world and linking this with our Science unit, focusing on how animals are adapted to their habitats.

In History, Year Two are exploring how seaside holidays have changed since the Victorian period and in Art we are making our own clay sculptures. As a class, we are working super hard and are really looking forward to seeing our final sculptural masterpieces!

Ash Class have been enjoying their new topic about digestion and food. In Science, we have looked at the journey that food takes through our body. Ash children have also been researching their favourite, healthy pizza toppings and bases and are looking forward to creating their own pizzas at the end of our Summer term.

This half term, Maple Class are looking at Ancient Greece and how this historical era has shaped our lives today. We have really enjoyed writing a persuasive letter to John Stones (England footballer) to help him understand about child labour. Maple pupils are very excited that a 3D printer has joined us, for the half term, and we will be using 3D printing software to create an item of our own!

Our Year 6 pupils, in Elder Class, have enjoyed an action packed three days, taking part in a range of outdoor, adventurous activities at Borwick Hall. Pupils have had the opportunity to enjoy team challenges, low ropes, canoeing, high ropes and climbing. Thank you to Mr Burns and Mrs Barry, who have kindly accompanied the children during their busy, exciting visit.
