## Class News

Acorn have fully been immersed in their new theme, for this half term, 'Fun at The Seaside'. They have been busy bees creating lots of props to use in their new themed home corner of an underwater world. The children received a mystery scroll that led them to different golden coins around school. They were super detectives and used the clues to crack the code to a mysterious box that had been left for us. What a fantastic hook into our new class text 'Pirates Love Underpants'! We are very much looking forward to learning all about different sea creatures and exploring non-fiction texts.

This half term, Oak Class will be learning all about The Congo Rainforest. We kick started our theme by turning our classroom into a rainforest and we made some super rainforest crafts to hang around our classroom. We then learnt about the seven continents of the world and began to learn a continent song to help us to remember them. We are excited to learn more about Africa, where The Congo Rainforest is and which animals live there.

In our English lessons, Elm Class have been enjoying the book, 'The Lighthouse Keeper's Lunch' by Ronda Armitage. Meanwhile, in our Maths lessons, we have been learning all about tally charts. Elm Class are particularly excited to be learning all about The Great Barrier Reef, but have been sad to learn about problems caused by plastic and pollution in the water.

Ash Class have enjoyed investigating our new Science topic 'States of Matter' by role playing the differences between solid, liquid and gas particles. Children have been so excited about our new Music unit as we are learning to play the recorder. Ash pupils have already learned the B and A notes, which they played so confidently. We look forward to learning some trickier tunes!

This half term, in Maple Class, we will be learning all about biographies and David Attenborough, in order to write a biography to celebrate this extraordinary environmentalist's life. In our History lessons, we have loved looking at the history of aviation and the invention of the wheel. We are very excited to be experimenting with different pop up mechanisms and then creating our own pop up design.

Elder have had a great start to the final term of this year and are busy working hard on their production. We've been so impressed with their dedication and hard work in learning their parts and they can't wait for you all to see it. They've also been enjoying their new book, 'Wonder' and have already produced some excellent formal and informal writing.

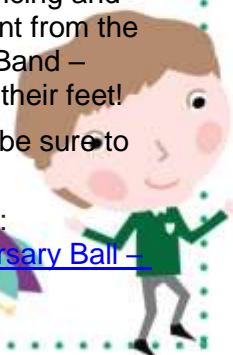

We are currently looking at our Kids Club provision for September 2025 and we are starting to compile our Breakfast Club and After School Club registers for next academic year.

In the first instance, we are asking everyone who would like a weekly, contracted pattern (which comes with a four week notice period) to let us know which regular days they would like at Breakfast Club and After School Club, please. Those who currently have contracts should now have received an individual email and are asked to reply to that personal email, please.

If anyone else would like a weekly, contracted pattern at our Kids Club, in September, please email [enquiries@coupegreen.lancs.sch.uk](mailto:enquiries@coupegreen.lancs.sch.uk), as soon as possible, stating the regular sessions you would like to request. Please can all emails be with us by the end of Friday 27th June. Thank you.

Once we have collected everyone's requests for places, we will look at our numbers, assess the demand, and consider the wrap around childcare provision we are able to make with a view to accommodating and meeting as many requests as possible. Once our Kids Club registers are finalised, we will then email you to confirm the regular weekly pattern we are able to provide for you.
