Sports Day

We look forward to our Sports Day next week, Wednesday 20th May, and welcome families to come and cheer the children on as they complete the track events.

This year, to support families with children across key stages, we will hold all of the track events in the morning.

Juniors (Y3 – 6) will begin the day, with their track events taking place from 9:00am until 10:15am.

Infant children (EYFS – Y2) will compete from 10:15am – 11:30am.

Families are welcome to join us on the school field between 9:00am and 11.30am to cheer the children on.

Feel free to bring your own lidded hot drinks to keep fuelled up, just in case we manage a parents' egg and spoon race!

We ask that those who are staying to watch will take a seat on the main field at 9:00am, ready for the events to begin.

Any parents that will be coming for the Infants only, will be asked to wait at the gate by the office, please, where a member of staff will then let you in at 10:15am.

Between 9:00am and 11.30am, the office answer phone will be turned on to take calls, as all staff will be supporting the events on the field.

Let's hope the weather remains fine so that the event can go ahead!

Attendance

School attendance is vital to children's development and successes both in learning and socially. Our whole school attendance is currently lower than the national expectation, with us sitting in the bottom 40%, and is significantly impacted by unauthorised absences due to term time holidays and unauthorised marks, due to lateness.

As a school community we need to work together to improve attendance so that all children have the full potential to thrive.

Next half term we, in partnership with our School Attendance Officer, will be contacting those families whose attendance and punctuality remains a concern to discuss ways in which we can help to improve this.

Kids Club – September 2026

We are now looking at our Kids Club provision for September 2026 and are starting to compile our Breakfast Club and After School Club registers for next academic year.

Please can everyone who would like a weekly, contracted pattern (which comes with a four week notice period) email

enquiries@coupegreen.lancs.sch.uk to let us know which regular days they would like at Breakfast Club and After School Club. Those who currently have weekly contracts should have already received an individual email and are asked to reply to that personal email, please.

Weekly contracted places will continue to be charged at £5 per child per session for Breakfast Club and £10 per child per session for After School Club. Please can all email requests for Kids Club places be with us by the end of Friday 22nd May. Thank you.

Following allocation of weekly bookings, we will then know whether or not we have ad-hoc places available for booking each day. Ad-hoc places includes those who currently book fortnightly places. These bookings can only be made for one half term at a time and cannot be guaranteed for the full academic year, as requests for weekly, contracted places take priority.

From September 2026, ad-hoc and fortnightly bookings will be charged at £6 per child per session for Breakfast Club and £12 per child per session for After School Club.
