## **Mobile Phones**

Last half term, some concerns were raised about mobile phones in school. We appreciate that some children bring a mobile phone to school for safety when walking home alone, or on certain days when they go to other homes. However, in order to keep all children safe in school, mobile phones must be turned off and handed in to the school office. To ensure that this is happening consistently and safely,

children who bring a phone to school will now have to take their mobile to the school office before entering their classroom and then collect it, once they have been dismissed from class, at 3:15pm. If children fail to do this and mobile phones are in bags, they will be confiscated and an adult will be contacted to collect the device at the end of the school day.

## **Our Super Power**

During our Monday assemblies, we have been exploring the film, 'Elemental' and the message it shares about love, equality and inequality. It has been amazing to hear the children discuss the power of people's words and behaviour and how they can impact others.
