These are our Golden Computing Rules.

Can I..?



1. **Ask** an adult to use technology at school and at home.
2. **Tell** a grown up straight away if you see something upsetting when online.
3. **Turn off** the screen (press the dolphin) if you see something you don't like on the screen.
4. **Only use** websites and apps that an adult has said you can.
5. **Remember** do not talk to people you don't know online.
6. **Always** keep your personal information private.

Can I..?



We always **ask** a grown up before using a laptop or iPad.

We should only **use websites** a grown up has said we can use or checked with a grown up that they are safe.



We should **never share our passwords** because it is private information.

- If we ever **see something we don't like**, close it and tell a grown up or click Dave the dolphin and close it immediately.



We make **sensible choices** when using the internet to keep us safe.

- We **look after the equipment**, putting iPads and laptops in the trolley as we found them- plugged in!

4. Make sure you have **consent** before sharing a photo of someone.
5. Keep your **passwords** for Spelling Shed and Times Table Rockstars to yourself.

In **Elder**, we know how important it is to be safe online.
These are our Golden Computing Rules.

- **Always** check privacy settings for all APPs **very carefully**.
- Don't post **personal information** online (for example, full name, address, mobile phone number etc).
- **Never share passwords** with friends or write them down where someone might find them.
- **Tell an adult** or trusted adult if something online makes you feel uncomfortable or worried.
- **Think very carefully** before posting something online.
