We should never share our passwords because it is private









- Always check privacy settings for all APPs very carefully.
- Don't post <u>personal information</u> online (for example, full name, address, mobile phone number etc).
- Never share passwords with friends or write them down where someone might find them.
- Tell an adult or trusted adult if something online makes you feel uncomfortable or worried.
- Think very carefully before posting something online.
