

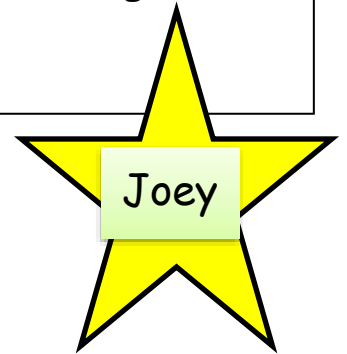


## All Stars 2 Spring Governors Report 2023

## All Stars in the Community

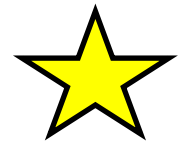
