

Incredibles Spring Term

The Incredibles class have returned after the Christmas holidays with a good work ethic. They have embraced new experiences and challenges and love the practical approach to their learning. Scrummy Crew, where the children have been practicing skills learnt in Maths such as measuring to make many tasty foods has been a particular hit. It has provided the opportunity for the children to practice skills linked to the school values like team work and positivity.



Maths

In maths we have looked at a variety of topics, starting by working on recognising numbers and place value followed by addition and subtraction. We then spent time exploring 2D and 3D shapes, the children enjoyed using the physical shapes to learn about their properties and how to sort them using Carroll or Venn diagrams. We have also learnt about measuring and weighing using standard and none standard units of measure as well as how to use the more than, less than and equal to symbols to compare numbers and measures.



English

In English we have learnt about traditional tales, classic stories that are based on a theme and instructions. The children have looked at stories they like and dislike and have been able to explain why. We focused on the Alien Tea party as this linked with our creative topic this term. They wrote about what we would have for their own tea party and made their own invitations.



Creative

This term we have investigated what it is like to live in space and all the equipment astronauts need to survive. We have explored how food is made and consumed differently to being on Earth including designing our own space menu. We have made rockets that all had a unique feature on them. We have looked at significant events that have happened including when the first rocket went into space, the first man on the moon and the significance of Mae Jemison in the space race.



Forest School

All the children have enjoyed all the activities completed in the forest this term, even if we did get a little wet and muddy at times! We learnt how to make bird feeders, whittle sticks and build dens. Everyone enjoyed all the activities, especially getting muddy!!



Thrive

In thrive the children have been having fun in their groups working on their action plans. Some children have enjoyed the use of the thrive rooms and others have made interesting creations, practicing methods of relaxation through yoga, mindfulness and music. The children have built on their social skills through paired and group games.
