- Mr Peel has kindly sorted four deer feeders and the hay. He has also done some research and has found out the deer's love salt lick so he is going to make some hanging salt licks. Salt Licks are really good and provide the minerals and nutrients that they need and can't get at this time of year.
- As mentioned in our last meeting/minutes, we needed some volunteers to take responsibility of checking on the amount of hay left and to inform Mr Peel for the refills. We had 5 volunteers from Sunshine 2a class and AN volunteered from Alphas. **Can class leads from these classes please liaise together and allocate these jobs when it best suits you.**
- Location of feeders: the council gave some great ideas for where we can place them around the grounds. We have a suggestion for the cabin area because of the cameras present there but also Mr Peel said that he has a wildlife camera with night vision. SM said that next to the fence near Sunshine's class is a good place. Then two feeds can be placed in the forest. So we have decided that we are going to have one Deer feed located in the cabins, one outside of the Sunshine 1 class, and two located in the forest.
- Mr Peel is making handmade Fairy Doors to transform our forest story area into a magical fairy land. The council were all in favour of this idea but we will need a number from each class to indicate those who are interested. - **please can class leads email Miss Clough directly with the result of the number of children who would like a door.** Once I receive this Mr Peel can make a start.
- Red Nose Day is THIS Friday 18th March. JC discussed that the money will help people live free from poverty, violence, and discrimination and that we can make a difference by raising money through being funny.
