Welcome to Superheroes Class. We work a little differently from the rest of school as we follow the Early Years Foundation Stage curriculum.



Our little Superheroes have been working extremely hard since September and this is clear from all of the incredible progress they have made! There are now 8 wonderful children in Superheroes who have been supported by our current staff team including Miss Slinger, Mrs Houghton, Miss Losardo, Miss Abbott and Mrs Ball. Physical Development

Outside play forms a huge part of our physical development activities. In PE, we have been using dance to develop our fundamental movement skills. We also took part in the hopping challenge for Rossendale Hospice. To support our fine motor skills, we have been using peg boards to support our co-ordination.



Communication and Language/Literacy

We have continued to develop our communication in Superheroes whether this be verbally, the use of PEC symbols or the use of Makaton. We use 'Singing Hands' to support the children in their understanding of different Makaton symbols and this term we have been focusing on emotions and weather signs. Each day, we have daily 'Rhyme time' and 'Sign time' and we are really proud of the children's engagement in these sessions. As part of our Literacy, we have continued to explore different stories including 'Jack and the Beanstalk', 'The Very Hungry Caterpillar' and 'The Little Red Hen' which has included various mark making opportunities.



Understanding the World and Expressive Arts and Design

Since our last report, we have been learning about lots of different events including St David's Day, St Patrick's Day, St George's Day, Easter, Eid and the coronation of King Charles III. We have tasted traditional foods, listened to the music associated with these events before using our creativity to create various art work. We have made collages, painting and baked biscuits and bread before making our own fruit salads for the Very Hungry Caterpillar.



Forest School

The children have loved their forest sessions with Miss Weldon. They have explored different natural materials such as using clay and mud to make potions and printing using sticks and stones. Some of the children have been tree climbing and are getting braver every week! It has been wonderful to see our little Superheroes exploring the world around them.
