During the day, our students will explore their creative skills learning art from the hands of the great maestro Antonio Gaudí and the secrets of his Trencadís Technique. Many Spanish speaking countries are in latitudes where heat can hit you hard, as hotter days arrive to London too children will make refreshing fans. Our students will also learn about the Mexican "Dia de los Muertos" (Day of the Dead) and they will make their own traditional skulls. We hope you are not scared when they bring them home!
