Dear Parents and Carers.



Covid-Care

If your child has any of the following symptoms cough, fever, loss of taste and smell:

- 1. Keep your child at home and notify school immediately
- 2. Arrange for your child to have a COVID test
- 3. If your child tests positive, notify the school immediately and keep them at home for at least 10 days
- 4. Make sure the whole household isolates for 14 days
- 5. If another household member tests positive your child must also isolate for 14 days.

COVID: The Importance of Isolation and Continued Care

As you are aware we have had three reported cases of COVID in our school since the beginning of term.

It is important to note that none of these cases are related to each other. This is an indication that the measures in school are effective and that the precautions we take around isolation are crucial in keeping any potential spread under control.

However it is still important that we are all maintaining current government guidelines outside and inside school. In school, we have maintained all safety measures as follows:

- Complete separation of all year groups (referred to as 'bubbles') through staggered playtimes and lunchtimes
- Increased sanitising/cleaning routines
- Regular handwashing by all adults and children
- Sanitising stations in every class and common areas
- Restriction of outside visitors including supply teachers as far as possible
- Separate staffroom areas for adults
- No gathering such as assemblies except for within year groups
- Remote communication with parents and carers
- 'Catch it , Kill it, Bin it' routines established
- Clear and speedy protocol routines for suspected cases
- Quick response to any positive cases in line with Public Health England advice

Please continue to reinforce handwashing routines for our children and if you suspect any symptoms in your household let us know immediately. Thank you for your continued support and co-operation.
