ABSENCE FROM SCHOOL

Children are required by law to attend school 180 days per year. The Government states that every child's attendance should be at least 90%.

How do YOU measure up?

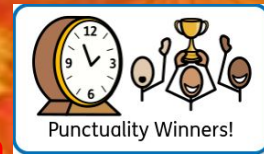

Punctuality Matters

On time	• Excellent punctuality • No learning time is lost
5 minutes per day	• A child who is 5 minutes late to school every day will miss <u>3 days</u> of school over the course of an academic year
10 minutes per day	• A child who is 10 minutes late to school every day will miss <u>6.5 days</u> of school over the course of an academic year
15 minutes per day	• A child who is 15 minutes late to school every day will miss <u>10 days</u> of school over the course of an academic year

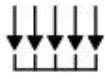

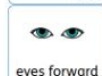
