




Today we will be...

Hi everyone!


I was really impressed with all of the designs for the moving minibeast pictures that you created for me!

Think, pair, then share your ideas.




The first thing you should do is look at your **design sheet** from the last lesson. Make sure that you...


...remember how

your moving picture.




...know what your order of work will be!







The **order of work** means what you will need to first, next, after that, and so on to make your moving minibeast picture.



Explain the order of work for one of the moving pictures above which uses the mechanism that you will be using.

The final, and most important, thing that you need to think about is...



Sit down at a table when you are cutting.

Never run with scissors.

scissor safety.



Always look carefully at what you are doing.



Cut in the direction away from your body.





Make sure your **fingers** are not in the way of the scissors.



If you are passing scissors to someone else, **close them** and hold them by the blades so that the other person can take the handles.



When you have finished using the scissors, put them away.

Make sure you follow all of these scissor safety rules!
