
Moving Minibeasts












Hi everyone! Tom here.

> In this final lesson, we are going to evaluate our completed moving minibeast pictures.






When we evaluate something, we look at how successful it is.


See what worked well

> Get into pairs and make sure you have your completed moving minibeast picture in front of you.




Does the mechanism work well?


Decide on a **score out of 5** together for each of your moving pictures.




Here is the next question to discuss with your partner about both of your completed moving pictures:

Share and explain your scores with the rest of the class.




Here is the last question to discuss with your partner about both of your completed moving pictures:


