




Who saw the sun?

This comforter is the Holy Spirit. You can't see or hear Him, but He wants to blow through us with His wind.



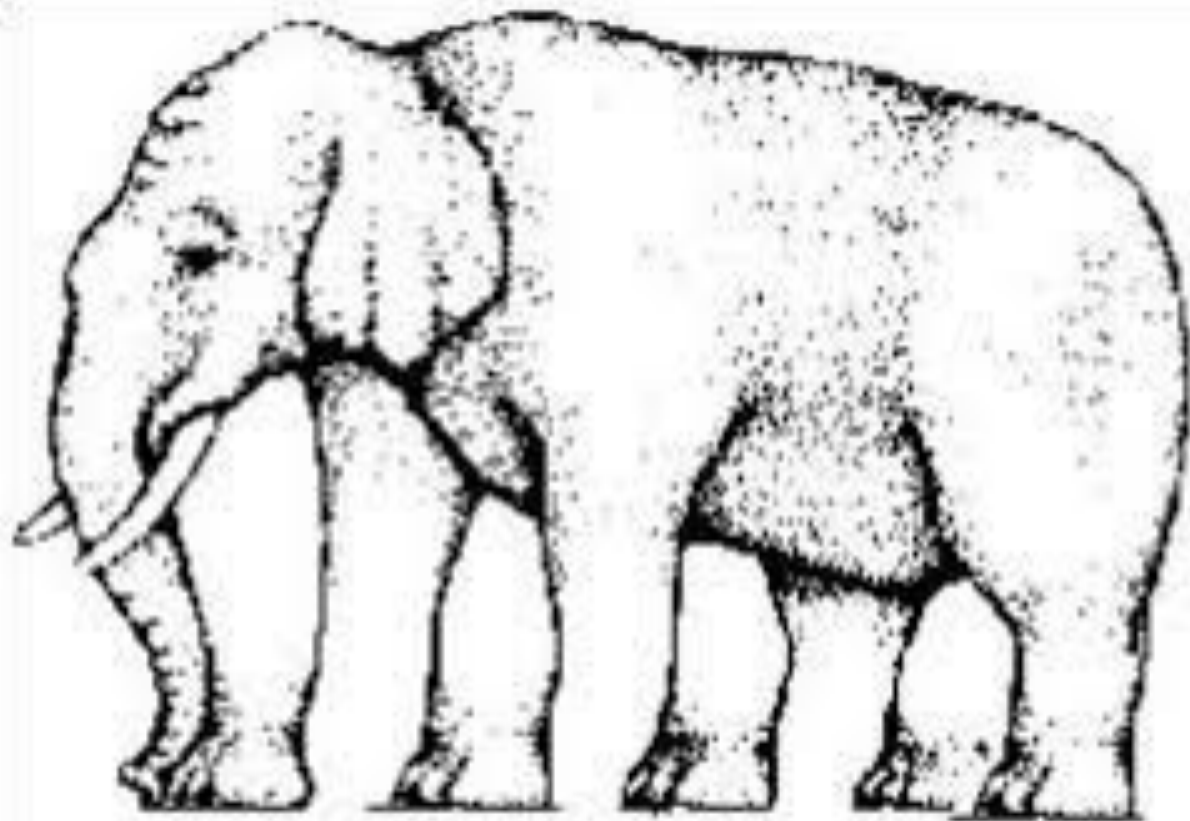
Christians believe that Jesus is alive through the Holy Spirit.
