What is Black History Month?

- Carter G. Woodson (an American Historian) discovered that Black people's history wasn't being shared with other people, or recognised.
- In 1926, he decided to create a celebration of the important achievements of Black people throughout history.
- This celebration became Black History Month.
- The first Black History Month took place in the UK in 1987.

W. INDIANS 100 p.c FOR BUS BOYCOTT

30/4/63

West Indians' boycott on Bristol's buses—in protest against the Omnibus Company's refusal to recruit coloured crew—was in full swing this afternoon.

A campaign leader said "We have got 100 per cent support from the city's 7,000 West Indians."

"None of them is using buses this afternoon. Although it is hard to tell, we are sure many white people are supporting us."

All-out fight

Bristol's West Indians are joining Parliament, Bristol City Council and all Churches to put pressure on the Omnibus Company to recruit coloured crew.

The main tactic is to refuse to use buses. The Bristol City Council has refused to demand racial discrimination in the company.

MP's DEMAND TOUGHER RACE HATE LAWS

A leading group of Black people in Bristol, led by Paul Stephenson, has written to the Home Secretary, Mr. Roy Jenkins, the new minister, asking for tougher legislation to deal with race hatred. They say that the law is not strong enough to prevent the kind of attacks which have taken place in London and in other towns. There have already been several "race riots" in this country.

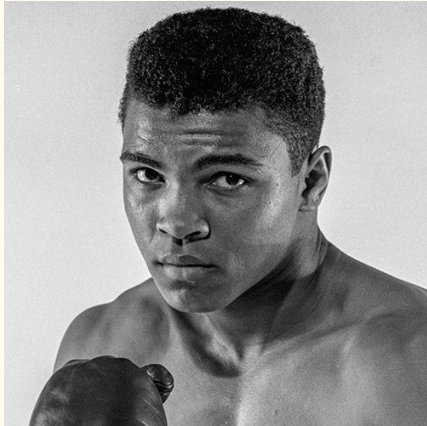
